

## **JOHN M. GREACEN**

Currently a principal of Greacen Associates, LLC, Mr. Greacen was director of the Administrative Office of the Courts of New Mexico, clerk of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Mexico, and clerk of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. He worked at the National Center for State Courts in Williamsburg, ultimately as deputy director for programs. He held leadership positions with the Police Foundation, the National Institute for Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention and the predecessor of the National Institute of Justice within the U. S. Department of Justice. He practiced law with the Washington office of Kirkland & Ellis and has been a member of the law school faculties at the University of Arizona and the Washington College of Law at American University. Mr. Greacen has an A.B. from Princeton and a J.D. from the University of Arizona. He is a member of the bar in Arizona, Colorado, the District of Columbia, New Mexico and the US Supreme Court. He has received the Director's Award for Excellence in Leadership from the federal courts, the Award of Merit from the National Association for Court Management, and the Pioneer Award from the New Mexico State Bar Association.
