WHEREAS, this matter came on for consideration by the Court upon request of the New Mexico Commission on Access to Justice (Commission) for authorization to continue its work presented in its 2010 annual report;

WHEREAS, this Court held a meeting on April 6, 2011, with all the legal services providers to learn and to solicit ideas for increasing civil legal services to low income families and to improve the efficient provision of such services in light of recent budget cuts;

WHEREAS, the Court having considered the request of the Commission, the suggestions received during the April 6, 2011 meeting, and being sufficiently advised, Chief Justice Charles W. Daniels, Justice Patricio M. Serna, Justice Petra Jimenez Maes, Justice Richard C. Bosson, and Justice Edward L. Chávez concurring;


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the 2010 annual report of the Commission is ACCEPTED;

1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission shall consider if any
2 of the funding sources for the civil legal services providers can be combined,
3 how the funding application process can be streamlined, how programs can
4 coordinate efforts and collaborate to function more efficiently, and report its
5 findings and recommendations to this Court within six months;


8 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall continue its oversight






