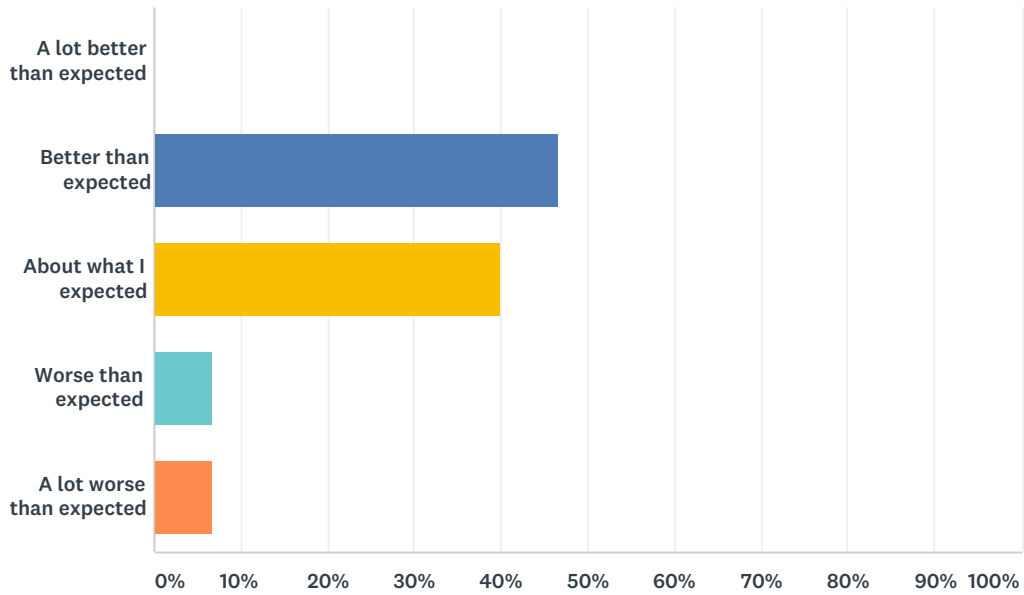


Q1 Overall, how did this CLE meet your expectations? Was it...

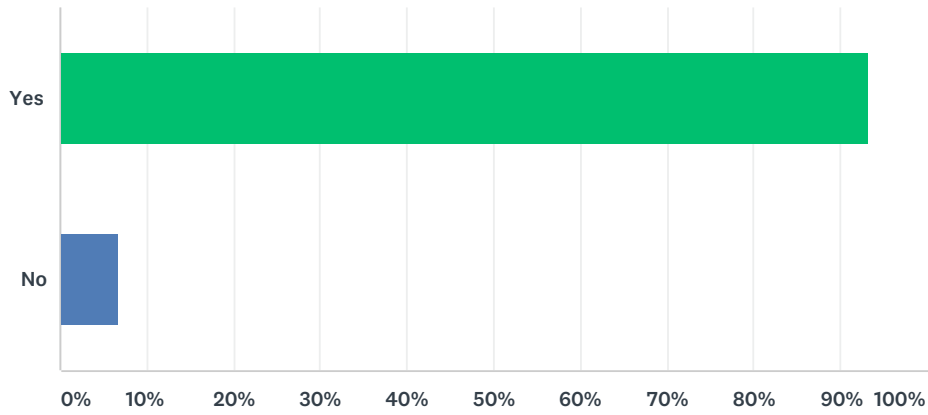

Q12 I prefer the following types of learning methods (please see descriptions below):

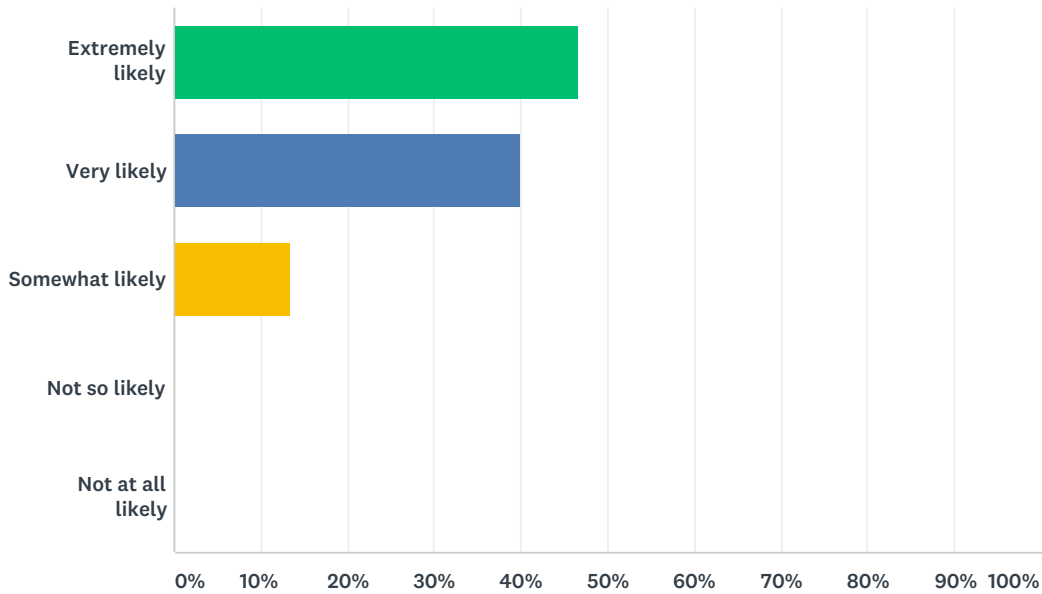
