

## Judicial Standards Commission

The Board of Bar Commissioners will make one appointment to the Judicial Standards Commission for a four-year term. The time commitment for service on this Commission is substantial and the workload is voluminous. Receiving, reviewing, and analyzing substantial quantities of electronic documents are necessary to prepare for Commission matters. Strict adherence to constitutional, statutory, and regulatory authority governing the Commission is mandatory, expressly including but not limited to confidentiality. Commissioners meet at least six (6) times per year for approximately three hours per meeting. In addition to regular meetings, the Commission schedules at least three (3) week long trailing dockets of trials. Additional trials, hearings or other events may be scheduled on special settings. Additionally, mandatory in-house training sessions may periodically take place. Unless properly recused or excused from a matter, all Commissioners are required to faithfully attend all meetings and participate in all trials and hearings. Appointees should come to the Commission with limited conflicts and must continually avoid, limit, or eliminate conflicts with the Commission's cases, Commission members, Commission staff and with all others involved in Commission matters.
